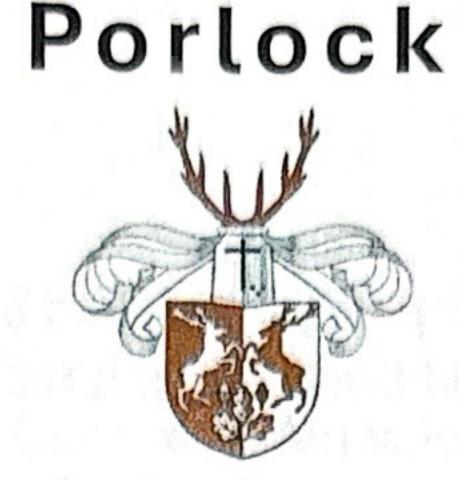

Grounds Policy C-2024-325

Cllr. D Heath introduced the draft policy which had been shared as pre reading. Highlighting that members should discuss how it manages weeds.

The Clerk provided an update to members on the recent press coverage regarding weed control and Minehead Town Council's own challenges to the problem. The recent trial of a foam had been rejected.

Members then discussed how to manage weeds and how they could ensure that the policy supported practical weed management in line with Council's Biodiversity Policy.

A member of the public made a suggestion that could Council set aside an area that encourages wildlife to offset areas that need to be maintained.

Cllr. D McCanlis proposed some amendments:

- 1.1 should include Council's default position is that herbicides, or similar chemical applications are not used and when such action is deemed necessary an application must be made to the Clerk who will consult with a member of the Council before granting permission.
- 1.4 Take positive steps to create environments that encourage indigenous life especially insects to thrive.

It was agreed in principle that more needed to be done in the education and promotion of Council's policies.

Cllr. F Nicholson provided an update on the boundary commission consultation, the view is to reduce Somerset Council member numbers from 110 to 96, creating boundaries that provide electoral equality in terms numbers circa 4,500. Porlock has an opportunity to influence the decision in regard to local boundary changes. Somerset Council do not make the decision, it is down to the Boundary Commission. Deadline 20th January 2024.

Highways remain under considerable pressure following ongoing headcount reduction.

Active Exmoor Travel grant is open that looks to seek opportunities to create better access to the national park. Open until March 2025.

C-2024-357 Christmas Lights & Trees Working Group

Cllr. S McCanlis provided an update. Trees have been ordered from AP Farmer; the trees will go up on the 28th November ready for lighting up on the 1st December. The Village Hall Maintenance Team will be putting up the big real trees. Volunteers will be putting the barrel trees and wooden trees along the shops. Where ladders are used three people will be required.

A couple of large artificial trees have been offered however it was decided not to accept them as they are very large, and the Working group didn't know where they could make use of them.

One set of solar lights had been purchased and trialled, which are very good and reduce the need for batteries. Further sets will be purchased.

C-2024-358 Community Health & Wellbeing programme being run by Somerset Association of Local Councils and Somerset Council.

Previous papers have been circulated to members. The Clerk gave an update that there are grants available however it was agreed by members that given resourcing issues, that there is no capacity to take up additional programmes, however the Clerk would collate council activities against the 11 strategic categories and identify where Council may wish to apply for funding in the future.

C-2024-359 Emergency Plan Working Group

Cllr. D McCanlis resigned as Working Group lead due to lack of capacity. It was discussed that Emergency Planning could potentially form part of business as usual operations run by the Clerk and in the first instance Council's emergency plan should be developed as part of its business continuity / business resilience.
