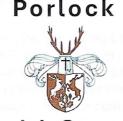

C-2024-083 Public: There is no sign for the Museum at Dovery Car Park

Council: In 2021 the High Street Support Group, set up by Porlock Parish Council (PPC) and funded by the then Somerset West & Taunton Council, did look into finger posts for the car park at the time, however the fund didn't stretch that far. Also recent discussions with the Chair of the Dovery Manor Museum included the question of signage visibility.

> Council: Responsibility lies with Somerset Council. If they are not required by law to do this then they won't as they are looking to save money. We are in discussion with Somerset Council and idverde about the service contract for the village.

C-2024-088 Public: What about the bins which are in a terrible state, with bins over flowing, bins missing?

> Council: This is all part of the same issue/discussion, the Environment & Community portfolio on the website contains a full report. Cllrs. have been emptying bins and taking the rubbish away to try and minimise the situation, as well as weeding in various parts of the village. Council are trying to get answers to these and other broader 'street' issues from Somerset Council. Council have Earmarked Reserves if this service is removed as part of devolution and Council are required to fund the solution.

C-2024-089 **Public:** Have we lost our street cleaner?

> Council: As far as Council is aware we have lost the street cleaner however we are following this up with Somerset Council and idverde.

C-2024-095 Somerset Council (SC)

Chair welcomed Somerset Cllrs. Steven Pugsley and Frances Nicholson to the meeting and brought item 23a forward in the interest of time efficiency for them.

Cllr. S Pugsley raised a question about the cutting of the vegetation in Central Car Park, as the maintenance team is due to come in the next two weeks and are conscious that stripping back could create complaints.

C-2024-096 Council agreed that car parking spaces should be cleared of vegetation and a border should be cut back leaving the majority of vegetation. Council also asked that chemical sprays are not used. The Clerk will be the contact for the maintenance team. Council also raised if Doverhay Car Park would done at the same time. Cllr. S Pugsley will report back and raise the question with maintenance team.

**C-2024-097** The Council also raised the earlier topic of refuse and general street cleaning with Cllr. S Pugsley.

Cllr. Pugsley requested that the Clerk send an email to him regarding street cleaning, bins and that the lack of street cleaning contributes to the blocking of drains; so Cllr Pugsley could raise the issue.

C-2024-098 Cllr. S Colson asked if there was any update on the Highway Steward and Lengthsman

Cllr. S Pugsley reported that the parishes within the Local Community Network (LCN) have insufficient funds, however he is continuing to pursue options. For now have to rely on the service that is provided as part of the hedge cutting service managed by Kier, the new contract provider to SC Highways. Hedges are the responsibility of the landowner, however verges are the responsibility of highways both vertical and horizontal.

Any issues on the roads hedges, verges, signs etc. are to be reported on the SC highways portal.

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## C-2024-099 The future use of the Old School Centre.

The Chair swapped item 10 and 11 in the order of the agenda

There was a summary of the suggestions submitted which covered a range of commercial and non-commercial ideas, the focus being on a flexible or dedicated space in one or both of the rooms. Ideas were discussed as to their merits and disadvantages and what facilities were already being offered in the village.

Discussions covered the current use of the space by the Parish Council, the Lovelace Resource Centre and the Library and the suitability of the current working environment, future potential needs, opportunities of expansion of services and staffing requirements.

Cllr. L Thornton raised that if we do not replace the income of the current tenancy and utilise the space solely as a community space then the Council will need to take on the rates and utility costs which would see a 5% increase in the precept as well as the costs of any material changes.

It was suggested that some of this potential cost could be offset by charging fees for any such activities that may look to hire the space and that there are many potential benefits to having a new flexible space for the whole community.

More work is required for Council to understand the costs involved in any future proposal both ongoing and implementation.

#### C-2024-100 Somerset Wildlife Trust report on the Old School Centre Community Garden

Council discussed the report and it was agreed that there was enough experience and knowledge in the Council and community to carry out its own study of the Community Garden. Access to the garden needs to be made a priority to make it accessible to all. Council should consider planting some recently discovered Porlock Pippin apple trees as suggested by a member of the public.

Council RESOLVED to set up an Old School Centre Community Garden Working Group (OSCCGWG), with Cllr. D Heath as lead Cllr. with its first task to carry out a survey on current vegetation and plan on next steps to help deliver the Council's commitment to Bio Diversity and with value for money. The OSCCGWG sits alongside other Working Groups under the Environment & Community Portfolio.

#### C-2024-101 Open floor

The Chair asked the attending public if they had any comments they wished to add?

**Public:** I'm interested in understanding what ideas the Council feel are feasible and how is this going to be funded, by whatever means.

**Public:** The PVCIC are planning on having 'drop ins' so there could be a clash there, but there will be many groups that would want to use such a space but at what cost and would that exclude some groups. It's a lovely space and should be maximised for all to use.

Cllr. L Thornton suggested that as Council start to discuss process and next steps that Council should think about a public session to share the ideas in more depth and those

being considered taken to the next stage and the cost impact assessed in terms of any increase in precept.

C-2024-102 Process and next steps to deciding the future of the Old School Centre

It was recognised that further discussions were required to flush out the detail including costs

The Chair suggested to move towards points in principle on deciding what should be in scope and what parts of the Old School Centre should be used for what. This was objected to by Cllr L Thornton & Cllr D Thornton. Cllr. L Thornton suggested that we had a dedicated meeting, open to the public, to discuss and consider the suggestions in more depth, publishing the suggestions for all to see. The remaining Cllrs. wanted to move to a high level decision on the principles of how the space could be used. This again was objected to by Cllr L Thornton & Cllr D Thornton as they felt no cost analysis had been carried out on any of the ideas put forward, a high level decision in principle couldn't be considered. Cllr. S Colson pointed out that a high level direction of travel was not precluding any analysis of costs, which would need to be done at the appropriate point.

C-2024-103 20:24 - Cllrs. D Thronton and L Thornton left the room in objection to the way the discussion was heading and being managed, and their objection to being repeatedly asked not to interrupt others when speaking.

**Public:** The idea of a public meeting could be ok if it was controlled and managed well and that a small piece should be shared on Facebook about the basic ideas of what is being considered. I also want to say the behaviour of those two Cllrs. was awful.

**Public:** If you can say what space is available for use then the community will have a clearer idea on what it could be used for.

**Public:** Would it be feasible to physically stand in the space to get a feeling for what the space could be used for.

**Council:** In an ideal world it would be great to have the public meeting in the space to share the ideas proposed, however we would have to discuss and agree how that would work with PVCIC.
