


PORLOCK YOUTH CLUB

This quarter, we've had steady attendance with several new young people taking part. The activities have been very successful, with lots of interest and enthusiasm.

The favourite session this quarter was our beach trip. We met at the recreation ground as usual and walked to the beach as a group. At the beach we built stone pillars, had some snacks, chatted, and had fun. Gareth taught the group some basic photography skills, and they took turns trying out his camera. Overall, a big success!

Our target sports session was very popular, and the young people loved the new addition to our target sports kit — plastic axe throwing! We also brought out our sucker archery kit.

At Easter, we organised an egg hunt across the whole playing field, making sure every young person took part and went home with an Easter bag full of chocolates, sweets, and stickers.

We also used our tag belts for a variety of games, including tag rugby, off-ground tag, and a big game of 'Tagageddon', all of which were very popular.

















We had planned to run a water fight night, but this wasn't possible because we had no outdoor water source and didn't want to get the carpet wet. Instead, we used a kit bag with a variety of sports equipment, including rugby, frisbee golf, badminton, and uni-hockey, which everyone enjoyed.

Our homemade stomp rockets worked fairly well, and the children loved getting involved. We have decided as a group that we'd like to do this activity again, but next time with better equipment to help us build more powerful rockets.

We also regularly played tennis, basketball, and football in the MUGA, along with games of tug-of-war, cricket and dodgeball.

Den building and the DIY crazy golf didn't attract much interest (surpisingly!), but the young people did enjoy using the golf clubs to chip balls around the playing field. For the future, we would like to invest in a grass-friendly golf set and run a golf competition.

We had to change our plan for the Bushcraft and Firepit evening due to the weather, but we will reschedule for the autumn, when the evenings get darker.
